#### City of Atlanta Board of Ethics and Independent Compliance Meeting Minutes of September 19, 2019

The monthly meeting of the City of Atlanta Board of Ethics and Independent Compliance was called to order by Board Chair Kate Wasch at 6:04 p.m. in the City Council Committee Room 1, 55 Trinity Avenue, Atlanta, Georgia 30303. Attending the meeting were board members Chris Gilmore, Todd Gray, Matt Grosvenor, Lisa Liang and Gerry Neumark. Ethics Officer Jabu M. Sengova and staff members Carlos R. Santiago, Sherry H. Dawson, Janet R. Keene, Larry Mason, Ibi Onabanjo and Portia Reeves also attended. Board members Nichola Hines and Wesley Tharpe were absent.

# MINUTES

1. Ms. Liang moved to approve the minutes of the July 18, 2019 board meeting. Dr. Neumark seconded the motion which was unanimously approved by the Board.

# **BOARD OPERATIONS**

2. Introduction and welcome of new board member, Matt Grosvenor Ms. Wasch introduced Matt Grosvenor, Partner in Financial Reporting and Assurance and Advisory Services at Bennett Thrasher LLP, nominated to the Board of Ethics and Independent Compliance by the Georgia Society of Certified Public Accountants.

# FINANCIAL DISCLOSURE HEARINGS

## 3. Documentary Evidence and Sanctions Requested

Mr. Santiago presented Exhibits 1 through 5 as documentary evidence of notices sent to persons who were required to file the City Financial Disclosure Statement pursuant to Section 2-814 of the Code of Ordinances. Ms. Liang made a motion to approve Exhibits 1 through 5 as proper notice of the requirements to file under Section 2-814. Mr. Gilmore seconded the motion which was unanimously approved by the Board.

Mr. Santiago presented evidence of persons who violated Section 2-814(e) of the Code of Ethics by failing to file the 2019 City Financial Disclosure Statement by the filing deadline without reasonable cause. He requested that the Board issue written reprimands and impose fines ranging from \$50 to \$250 in administrative sanctions and require that all fines be paid by the delinquent filers prior to any reemployment by the City.

Ms. Harris was present at the meeting and addressed the Board. Ms. Harris stated that she filed an appeal when she received an invoice for payment from the Ethics Office and she contacted the office. She stated that while employed

with the City, she timely filed her financial disclosure statements annually and did not realize that she was required to file one year after her retirement from the City. Thereafter, Ms. Harris requested a waiver of the fine. Following a brief discussion, Dr. Neumark made a motion that Ms. Harris' case be deferred for further review by the Ethics Office and be presented at the October meeting of the Board. Mr. Grosvenor seconded the motion and it was unanimously approved by the Board.

#### **FD-19-096** In the Matter of Marvin Lenorris Taylor, Sr. (late filer) Current City Employee: filed 7/6/19 Sanction requested: \$250

Mr. Santiago presented a recommendation that the fine be reduced in this case from \$250 to \$125. Mr. Taylor was present at the meeting and addressed the Board. Mr. Taylor stated that he had not filed the City Financial Disclosure Statement in his six years as a city employee, and this was his first year that he was required to file. He explained that the reason his filing was not timely was due to technical difficulties with accessing the system. Mr. Gilmore made a motion to reduce Mr. Taylor's fine to \$125 with the recommendation that he timely file his disclosure statement going forward. Mr. Gray seconded the motion and it was unanimously approved by the Board.

Mr. Santiago presented the cases to the Board to find the late filers in violation of Section 2-814 and adopt the appropriate sanctions in each case. Mr. Gray moved to find the late filers listed in violation of Section 2-814 and to adopt sanctions as presented by Mr. Santiago. Ms. Liang seconded the motion and it was unanimously approved by the Board.

## 6. Late Filers – Appeals Filed

Mr. Santiago presented appeals in five late filer cases and requested the matters be entered into the record as Exhibit 6. Ms. Liang made a motion to enter Exhibit 6 into the record as evidence of the respondents' appeals. Mr. Gilmore seconded the motion which was unanimously approved by the Board.

Dr. Neumark seconded the motion and it was unanimously approved by the Board.

Mr. Santiago reported that Mr. Marshall filed an appeal explaining he had left City employment and did not believe he was required to file the disclosure statement. Mr. Santiago requested that the Board deny the appeal. Ms. Liang moved to find Mr. Marshall in violation of Section 2-814 and to adopt the sanctions as

presented. Mr. Gray seconded the motion and it was unanimously approved by the Board.

Former Board Member: filed 9/16/19 Sanction requested: \$125

Mr. Santiago reported that Ms. Morgan filed an appeal indicating she did not know that she was required to complete the form and that she believed the notices were sent in error. Mr. Santiago recommended reducing the fine to \$125. Ms. Liang moved to find Ms. Morgan in violation of Section 2-814 and to adopt the reduced sanctions as presented. Mr. Gilmore seconded the motion and it was unanimously approved by the Board.

Former City Employee: filed 4/25/19 Sanction requested: \$50

Mr. Santiago reported that Ms. Terry filed an appeal indicating she had been instructed by her former City supervisor that her business with the City had concluded and that no further action was necessary. Mr. Santiago recommended denial of the appeal for lack of reasonable cause. Dr. Neumark moved to find Ms. Terry in violation of Section 2-814 and to adopt the sanctions as presented. Mr. Gilmore seconded the motion and it was unanimously approved by the Board.

## 7. Nonfilers – No Appeals Filed

Ms. Onabanjo presented evidence that the nonfilers listed below violated Section 2-814 of the Code of Ethics by failing to file the 2019 Financial Disclosure Statement without reasonable cause. Having no opposition, Ms. Onabanjo submitted that the facts as stated in the administrative decisions should be admitted as evidence and form the basis for penalties imposed in the cases. Ms. Onabanjo proposed penalties pursuant to Board Rule 8.9 for each case as follows: administrative sanctions of \$500, issuance of a written public reprimand, recommendation that for those who are former employees that the City consider them ineligible for rehire for one year and for those who are board members that the City consider them ineligible to serve on a City Board for one year, and the requirement to pay any fines owed prior to reemployment by the City or reappointment to a City Board.

Ms. Keene briefly outlined the history of the financial disclosure requirement in the City of Atlanta and the more recent history of auditing the filed statements. She referenced Section 2-814 and that the audits are testing to the policy.

#### 9. Status Report on Activities Performed under the Work Plan

Ms. Sengova reported on activities that support the Ethics Office Work Plan in the following areas: operations, training, advice, public education and outreach, investigations and enforcement actions, and financial disclosure.

Ms. Sengova reported that she had participated in an FBI Outreach program in Washington, DC hosted by the Ethics and Compliance Section of the FBI. She also highlighted the Ethics Office's continued training efforts citywide. She further reported the Office is exploring a new phase of online training and that the recently published summer newsletter is available in print and online.

#### 10. FY2020 Budget Report

Ms. Sengova reported that the Ethics Office was spending as budgeted for the 2020 fiscal year.
